To be eligible, the student should be from a first-generation (college) family and/or have limited family income. Our program helps prepare students to enter any college they desire by offering study skills, SAT and ACT preparation advice, college admissions help and a six-week summer residential program in which students earn high school elective and college subject credit(or dual enrollment depending on high school).

If you are qualified for the program we will email you the full application package to complete. Students in grades 9, 10 and 11 are eligible.
