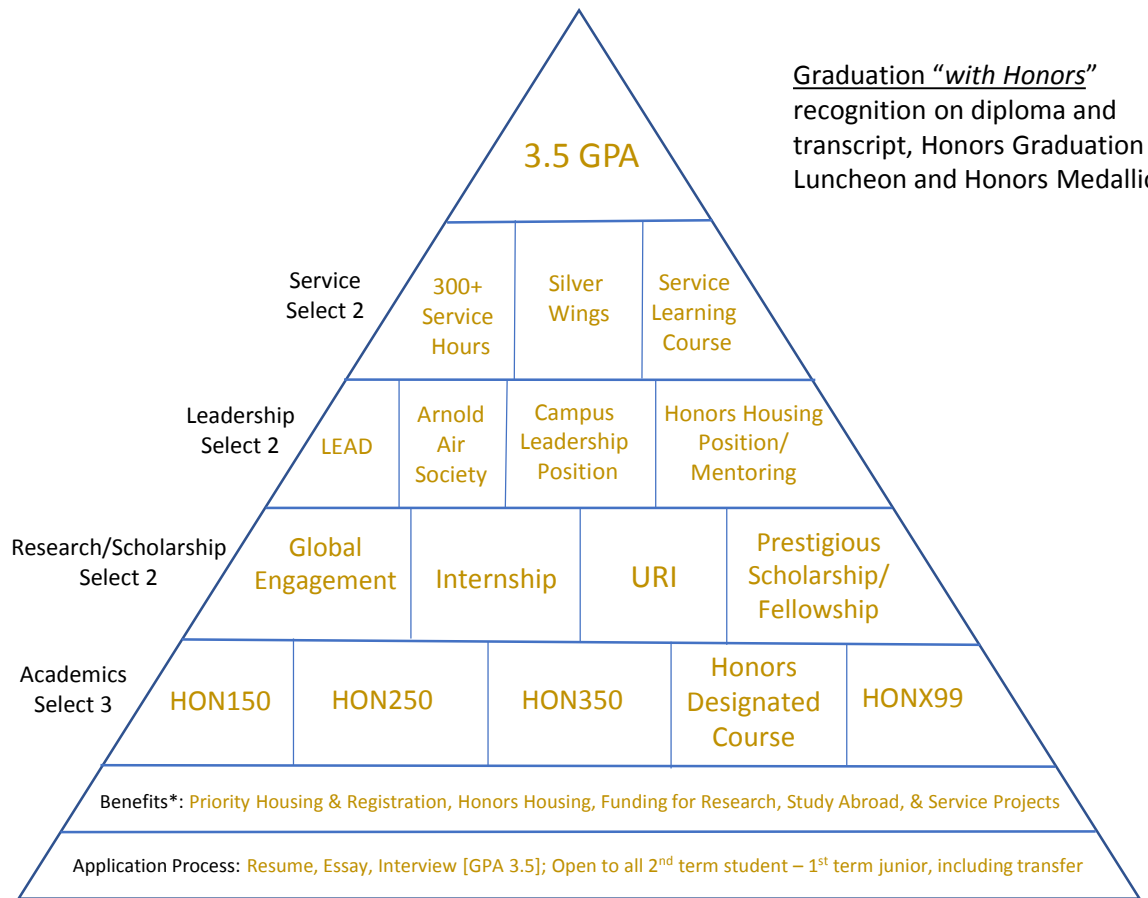
Mission
