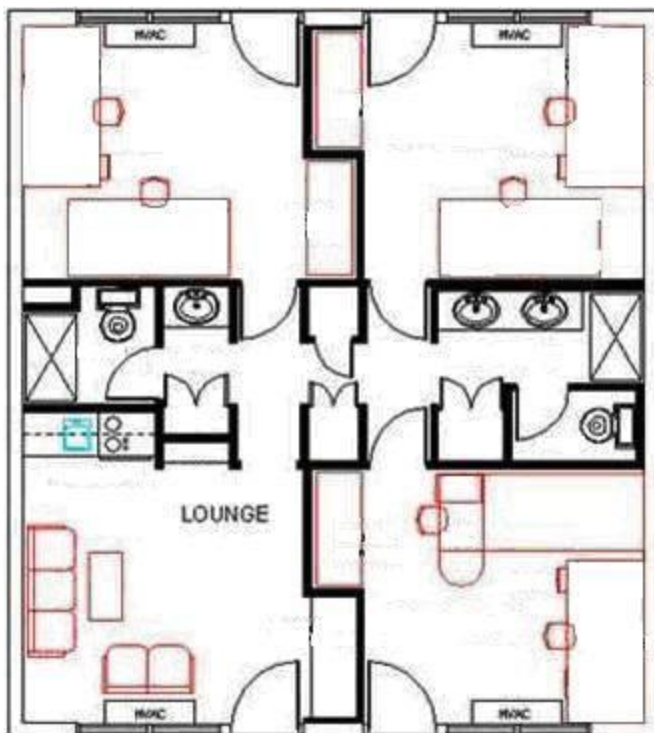


THE RESIDENCE HALLS

There are two unique housing communities on campus; each with its own personality and traditions. The Mingus Mountain Complex comprises a unique mix of students who are both first-year and continuing. This mix of students will help to provide the first-year student with insight into what one may experience during the first year in college. The Village Complex residence halls serve the needs of continuing and transfer.

Freshmen Options

All freshmen are part of the First Year Experience (FYE). The FYE focuses on assisting students in the transition to college and ERAU by providing events and activities geared to meet their needs and build a strong community. Students in the FYE live together by major (when possible) and have a staff that is specially trained to handle freshman transitional issues.

Mingus Mountain Complex

Roadrunner, Coyote, Quail, and Elk (Halls 1 - 4) – Suites in these halls feature three two-person bedrooms, two bathrooms, and a lounge with a kitchenette.

The lounge is furnished with a couch and a loveseat. The kitchenette comes equipped with a small sink with disposal, two-burner electric stove top, cabinetry, microwave oven, and a three-quarter size refrigerator unit.

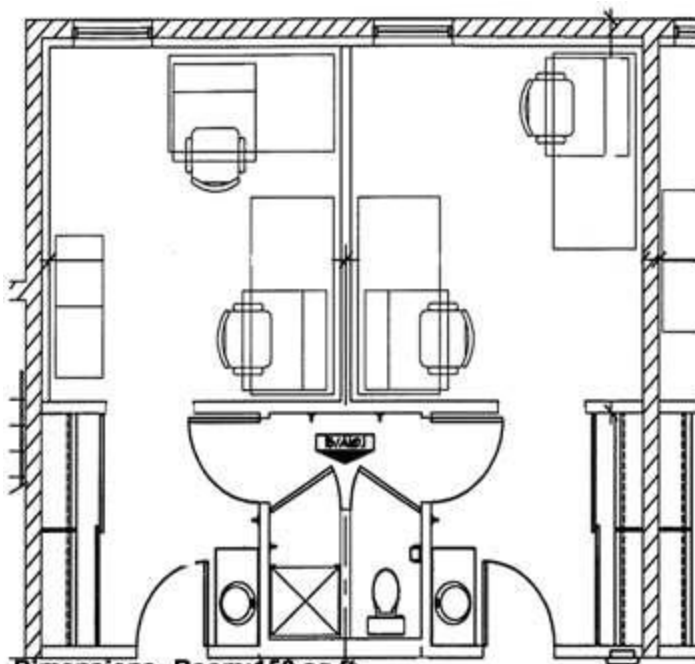
All student rooms are carpeted and the bedrooms and lounges have cable television access including Riddle Vision, our campus movie channel. Each bedroom has its own telephone and high-speed internet ports, and each student has his/her

Bedroom furniture includes a lofted or standard bed assembly with built-in desk (varies from room-to-room based on furniture component availability), movable dressers and built-in closets.

The bedrooms and lounge are individually climate controlled.

Javelina (Hall 5) - Suites in this hall feature 3 two-person bedrooms, 2 bathrooms, and a lounge. The lounge is furnished with a couch and a loveseat, built-in cabinetry and shelving, and a study table and chairs. Each bedroom has a Microfridge unit. All student rooms are carpeted and the dressers and closets are built-in. All bedrooms and lounges have cable television access including Riddle Vision, our campus movie channel.

Each bedroom has its own telephone and high-speed internet ports, and each student has his/her own voice mailbox. Bedroom furniture includes a lofted or standard bed assembly with built-in desk (varies from room-to-room based on furniture component availability), and built-in closet and dresser areas. The bedrooms and lounge are individually climate-controlled.

The Village Complex Suites

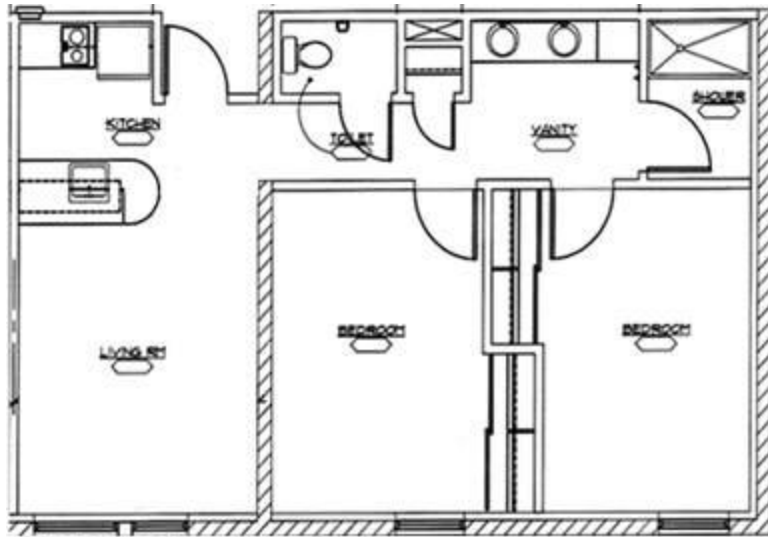
Suites: The Village Suites feature two double-occupancy bedrooms (Manzanita Hall) or single occupancy bedrooms (Juniper Hall and Dells Hall) with a shared bathroom.

Bedrooms come fully furnished with two beds (loft-able or bunk-able where available by Housing or University staff), two desks, two chairs, two dressers, and a built-in closet area.

Manzanita Hall has two community lounges and kitchens while both Juniper Hall and Dells Hall have one community lounge and kitchen each.

The community kitchens offer an electric range, microwave oven, refrigerator, and sink.

Residents must provide their own cooking and eating utensils.

The Village Complex Apartments

Apartments: The Village apartments feature two double-occupancy bedrooms, a living room, kitchen, and bathroom areas.

Bedrooms are fully furnished with two beds, two desks, two chairs, two dressers, and a built-in closet area.

The kitchen comes with a two-burner stove top, microwave oven,

sink, and full-sized refrigerator.

The living room area is furnished with a couch, chair, coffee table and an end table. Furniture in the common areas may vary from room to room.

Residents are required to furnish their own dishes and cooking utensils.

Each hall has one community kitchen on the top floor.
