We look forward to being involved in this wonderful new chapter in your life!



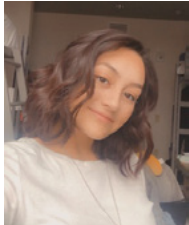

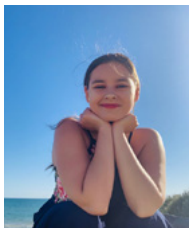
CHARLIE SWEETLAND

Junior | Software Engineering – Cyber Track

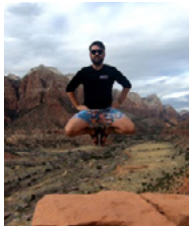

Junior | Aerospace Engineering – Astronautics Track

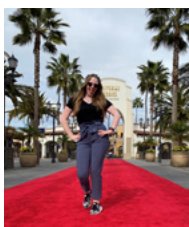

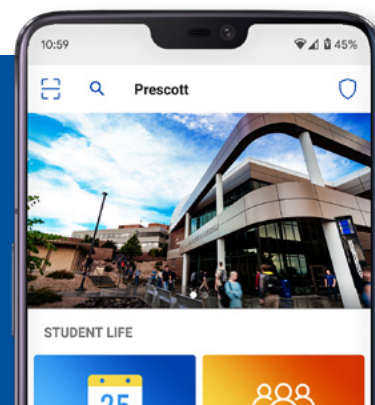

UTILIZING YOUR ERNIE STUDENT CENTER

ERNIE (Embry-Riddle Network for Information Exchange) is the campus online portal and your Student Homepage is the place to go to view your student account information and access online forms and processes. Sign in at ernie.erau.edu and then click on Campus Solutions Student Homepage.

ENROLLMENT AGREEMENT

The State of Arizona requires each student to complete an Enrollment Agreement. You can navigate to this online form by logging into your ERNIE account, clicking on the Forms tab, scrolling down to the Office of the Registrar section and clicking on the Enrollment

Agreement link. If you will not be 18 years old by August 24, your legal guardian must also sign this document. For further information, please contact the Records Office at 928.777.3808.

FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE

A Financial Disclosure must be completed electronically by all students. In the Student Homepage, select the Finances tile and click on the Complete Financial Disclosure link. Click on the Grant Permissions button and follow the steps.

AUXILIARY ACCESS

Student information is protected by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) but students can allow parents or others to access their information by providing them with Auxiliary Access in our student information system. If you want your parent/others to be able to review your information or pay online on your student account you must set them up with Auxiliary Access.

To give parents or others access, click on Campus Solutions Student Homepage link in ERNIE, click the Profile tab and select Auxiliary Access. Follow the steps on the screen. You may add up to three users. Students set the PIN number and password to share with those given access. Those with access should be prepared to provide the PIN number when calling the University for information on your account. An email will be sent to the person you grant access to giving them the PIN and sign on information but it is up to you to inform your users of the password you have set up for them. Students may also remove users in this same process.

STUDENT ACCOUNT

The University does not send out monthly statements. Students have the responsibility of reviewing their account online on a regular basis. In the Student Homepage click on the Finances tile and click on the link My Student Account.

CLASS SCHEDULE

To view and print your class schedule, login to Campus Solutions. Navigate to Campus Community and then Student Services Center (Student). Type in your Student ID number and click Search. On the Student Center tab, click on My Class Schedule. Click on the printer link to print your schedule.
